

COVID-19 Relief Legislation To Date

The American Rescue Plan is preceded by and builds upon seven previous laws designated to address the economic impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic.

March 6,
2020

Coronavirus Preparedness and Response Supplemental Appropriations Act

\$8.3 billion - First stimulus funding for federal agencies (HHS, State Dept., and SBA)



March 18,
2020

Families First Coronavirus Response Act

\$192 billion - First public assistance provisions, including paid sick leave and free COVID-19 testing.



March 27,
2020

The Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act, or CARES Act

\$2.2 trillion - First relatively comprehensive stimulus bill addressing the sweeping economic impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic.



April 24,
2020

Paycheck Protection Program and Health Care Enhancement Act

\$484 billion - Funding added to existing programs either deemed underfunded or ran out of funding, including PPP and EIDL.



July 13,
2020

Emergency Aid for Returning Americans Affected by Coronavirus

\$9 million - Temporary assistance for U.S. citizens and their dependents returning from foreign countries due to a crisis.



October 1,
2020

September 2020 Continuing Resolution

Continuing FY2021 appropriations to federal agencies.



December 27,
2020

The Consolidated Appropriations Act 2021

\$900 billion - Second relatively comprehensive stimulus bill addressing the economic impacts of COVID-19 since the CARES Act.



March 11,
2021

American Rescue Plan Act

\$1.9 trillion - More funding allocated for states, tribal, and local governments. Much of this funding can be used through December 31, 2024.
